#### 說明

- 一、112 學年度第1 學期於 112 年9月 11 日開學暨正式上課,請同學務必上網查看個人課表,按時上課。 (課程資訊以 e 校園服務網之選課手冊暨課程綱要查詢系統為準)。
- 二、第一輪加退選時間於 112 年 9 月 5 日至 8 日辦理, 第二輪加退選時間於 112 年 9 月 15 日至 19 日辦理。 各年級加退選時程請參閱選課時間表(附件一或至<u>靜宜大學</u>→e 校園服務網→選課手冊暨課程網要查詢 →點選右上角選課時間表查詢), 敬請同學把握選課時程辦妥選課。
- 三、依本校 112 學年度第 1 學期行事曆(附件二或至<u>靜宜大學</u>→點選右上角校園行事曆): 期中統一會考於 112 年 10 月 28、29 日,期末統一會考於 112 年 12 月 23、24 日舉行。
- 四、考試請假一律採線上申請,如為期中考考試,由任課教師處理補考事宜;如為期末考考試,除任課教師處理補考事宜外或可由綜合業務組辦理統一補考。相關規定依本校「靜宜大學學生考試請假及補考辦法」辦理,辦法請參閱附件四(或至綜合業務組→章則辦法→課務相關法規查詢)。
- 五、同學篩檢陽性輕症或無症狀者,請依本校請假規定辦理。篩檢陽性中重症者,可請「防疫隔離假」,並 依隔離治療通知書所載日期核給日期,不列入出缺席紀錄,亦不扣減學期評量成績。因應國內疫情趨 緩,教師將不再提供線上課程。

- 十、104學年度起入學之碩、博士生於提交指導教授申請表前,需通過臺灣學術倫理教育課程測驗。本校自 109 學年度起研究生申請學位考試簽文,需檢附經指導教授簽名確認之論文線上原創性檢驗比對報告 電子檔。論文比對結果需:1.具有完整之論文名稱;2.報告最末頁『排除引述』及『排除相符處』須為 關閉,『排除參考書目』則由學系(所、學位學程、班)自訂。比對結果以不超過25%為原則,特殊個案 需由指導教授說明理由,經學系(所、學位學程、班)主任簽名後,隨同研究生申請學位考試簽文呈核。
- 十一、 請同學務必遵守智慧財產權合理使用範圍,使用正版教科書,切勿影印複製與下載散播未經授權之 著作。著作使用範圍及資訊,請參閱<u>靜宜大學保護智慧財產權宣導網站</u>。
- 十二、 請留意個人資料保護法之相關使用規範,並妥善保管同學通訊資料避免不當使用及外流。

  - 3. 每學期校際選課之學分數,大學部學生修習學士班課程不得超過九學分,碩、博士班學生修習碩、博士班課程,以一科為限,如修習學士班課程,以九學分為限,且校際選課學分數應併入當學期修習學分數上、下限計算。

# **Subject: Notice for the Beginning of 2023-24AY 1st Semester. Descriptions:**

- 1. The 1<sup>st</sup> semester of 2023-24AY **shall reconvene and the classes begin on September 11, 2023**. Please check your personal class schedule online and attend the classes accordingly. (All course information is subject to the Course Registration Manual and Course Outline Enquiry on e-Campus Service Network.)
- 2. The schedule for 1st round Drop & Add is September 5 to 8, 2023. 2nd round Drop & Add is September 15 to 19, 2023. Please refer to the course registration schedule for each year (See Appendix 1 or go to th homepage of PU → e-Campus Service → Course Selection and Course Outline Inquiry System → click on the Course Selection Information at the upper right corner.) Please follow the schedule to complete course registration.
- 3. In accordance with the Academic Calendar of 2023-24AY 1<sup>st</sup> semester (Appendix 2 or homepage of <u>PU</u> → click the University Calendar at upper right hand corner): **Unified midterm exam is scheduled on October 28-29**, **2023**; **Unified final exam is scheduled on December 23-24**, 2023.
- 4. All exam leave applications are handled online. For Midterm Exam, the instructors shall handle the arrangements for the make-up exam; for Final exam, the instructors can handle the issues themselves or authorize the Div. of R&C for group make-up exam. Relevant regulations are handled in accordance with the <u>Providence University Regulations on Leave of Absence for Exams and Taking Make-up Exams</u>; for details, please refer to Appendix 4 (or go to the website of <u>Div. of R&C</u> → Regulations → <u>Curriculum</u>).
- 5. If a student tests positive with mild symptoms or is asymptomatic, please follow the university leave regulations for students. If a student tests positive with moderate or severe symptoms, the university will grant an "epidemic isolation leave" according to the date specified in the isolation treatment notice. The leave will not be counted as an absence and will not affect the student's grades, either. As the domestic epidemic situation improves, teachers will no longer provide online courses.
- 6. Due to the Double Tenth National Day holiday, the makeup classes for those on October, 9, 2023 will be held on September 23, 2023 (Saturday). Please make sure to be informed about the rescheduled class times and locations from your instructors in advance.
- 7. Class suspension notice: Teacher's Day on September 28, 2023 (Thursday), Mid-Autumn Festival on September 29 (Friday), and adjusted holiday on October 9 (Monday) will be made up on September 23 (Saturday), National Holiday on October 10 (Tuesday), University's Sports Day on November 30 (Thursday), School Anniversary on December 25 (Monday), Founding Day of the Republic of China on January 1, 2024 (Monday), and days for President, Vice President, and Legislative Elections on January 13 (Saturday) are all one-day holidays. If a national holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, classes will be suspended for one day. In case of special circumstances, further notice will be given in advance.
- 8. Starting from the 112th academic year, our school's teachers have switched to using the WOW Class platform for uploading lecture notes and teaching materials (e-learning has been discontinued). For the user manual, please log in to the e-Campus Service → Multiple Learning → WOW Class → click on the upper right ? icon for further information.
- 9. For other related matters, please refer to Appendix 5.
- 10. Effective 2015-16AY, all students in Master's and Doctoral programs must pass the exam of Taiwan Academic Ethics Education courses prior to submitting the application for advisory professors. Effective 2020-21AY, the application for degree examination must be accompanied by the e-file of the online originality inspection and comparison report for the thesis endorsed by the Instructing Advisor. The results of the paper comparison must: 1. Have a complete paper title; 2. In the last page of the report "Excluded Quotes" and "Excluded Matches" must be closed, and the "Excluded Bibliography" shall be at the discretion of the relevant department (institute, degree program, class). The comparison result is based on the principle of less than 25%. Special cases need to be explained by the Instructing Advisor, signed by the head of the department (institute, degree program, class), and submitted with the application for degree examination.

- 11. Students must comply with the scope of reasonable use of intellectual property rights and use only the legitimate edition of textbooks. DO NOT photocopy or download unauthorized works. For the scope and information on intellectual property rights, please refer to <a href="PU Intellectual Property Rights">PU Intellectual Property Rights</a>.
- 12. Please pay attention to the relevant regulations of Personal Data Protection Law and properly safeguard the directory data of other students to avoid improper use and data breach.
- 13. The secretaries of all departments and OIA Office are requested to help relay the above information to the Foreign Students, Mainland Chinese Students, and Exchange Students.

- A. The rules on how absence results in the grade deduction for the respective courses are detailed in the "Grading Methods and Ratio" column of syllabus. To enquire, please refer to the <u>Course Registration Manual and Course Outline Enquiry</u>.
- B. In accordance with Article 34 of the <u>PU Academic Regulations</u>, "the total hours of excused absence and unexcused absence in a course by a student that exceeds the threshold expressly announced by the course instructor for point deduction should be reflected in the grade report of such course."
- C. Student's photos are included in the roll calling system and exam sign-in sheet so that teachers can get to know students' better. Students are encouraged to study diligently and learn from the teachers.
- D. Please comply with the <u>PU Regulations on Examination</u> in all exams; offenders shall be handled by the Office of Student Affairs under the <u>Student Disciplinary Guidelines</u>.
- E. To apply for cross-university courses at other universities, please follow the regulations below (for details, please refer to the *PU Academic Regulations*).
  - 1. Cross-university courses are open only to those that are not offered at PU in the current semester. Students of deferred graduation are not subject to this regulation.
  - 2. All applicants who apply for cross-university courses must apply online during the announced period. Upon the approval of the attending department and relevant units of Office of Academic Affairs, students then bring the approved application form to make course registration and make payment at the host university. Prior to the deadline of Drop/Add, the applicant shall turn in the course registration slip approved by the host university to the Div. of R&C for record.
  - 3. The number of credits earned in cross-university courses is a maximum of 9 credits per semester for undergraduate students taking undergraduate courses; one subject per semester for graduate students taking graduate course; 9 credits per semester for graduate students taking undergraduate courses. The number of credits earned in cross-university courses shall be incorporated into the upper and lower credit limits of the current semester.
